witch /wɪtʃ/ (n) A *witch* is a woman with a tall, black hat. *Witches* fly at night.

skeleton /'skelətən/ (n) Years after people die, only their *skeleton* is under the ground.

scary /'skəri/ (adj) Some people like *scary* movies. When somebody *scares* you, you are afraid.

scream /skri:m/ (v/n) People *scream* when they are very afraid.

mayor /'meɪə, mer/ (n) Most towns have a *mayor* and he or she is the boss.

“It was great, Jack!” people shouted. “We loved it! It was beautiful!”

“Yes,” the Mayor said. “We all enjoy Jack’s scary songs and dangerous moves. Jack, you’re the scariest skeleton in Halloweentown! Thank you for these wonderful **celebrations...**”

“No problem,” Jack said.

But Jack wasn’t happy. Every year he repeated the same songs and moves and he was bored with Halloween. Of course, he couldn’t tell anybody. How could he? The people of the town liked him and they waited all year for this night.
