Spaking Assessment Prompts Unit 2







- Ask the student to make a chart of playground activities or general outdoor activities. Draw a basic chart on the board for the student to copy, or pass out a chart that can be filled in. In the first column, have the student write his/her name and the names of two other students. Then have the student fill in headers for at least four columns naming activities (e.g., jump rope, play soccer, ride a bike, etc.). Have the student check the activities he/she likes to do and those that his/her friends like to do. Prompt the student to tell about each activity listed and to ask about the other students: What do you like to do? What does your friend like to do?
- 2 Gather three items used in games or sports, such as a tennis ball, jump rope, and baseball glove. Have the student identify spatial relationships. Place the jump rope behind the ball and ask: Where is the ball? Then ask: Where is the jump rope? Elict full sentences, e.g., The ball is in front of the jump rope. The jump rope is behind the ball.



Challenge:

Prompt the student to give you directions for moving the items. Have him/her tell you: Put the ball next to the baseball glove. Move the glove between the jump rope and the ball.

3 Have the student look at the picture and find all the pieces of equipment (jump rope, slide, soccer ball, skates, helmet, bike, skateboard, baseball bat, swing). Encourage the student to point to the items as you name them. Say: Point to the slide. Ask: What is he/she doing / playing? What are they doing / playing? Where is the...? (between/next to/in front of/behind). Ask the student to make sentences about the picture.
