"That's a good idea," said Dad. "We can use things from the ship."



The boys were excited. "Let's go!" they shouted. The family climbed on the raft and sailed toward the island.








As they sailed closer to the island the children began to feel a little frightened. "There might not be any food to eat!" cried Jack.
