In the Speaking test, you may want to talk about other people and say their names. For example, you can say: 'My sister's name is (Maria) and my brother's name is (Vincenzo).'

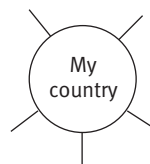
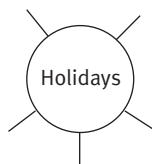
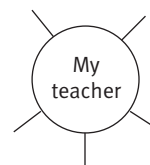
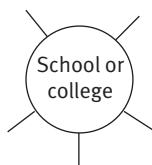
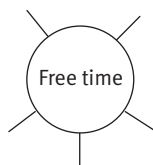
